- Secretariat of over 1000 people, with 60 offices around the world.





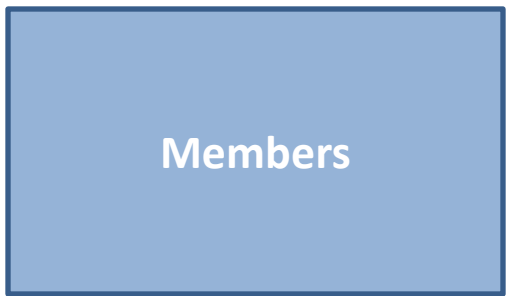
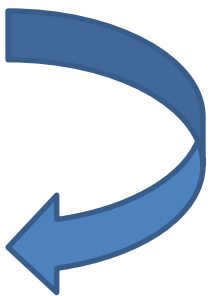
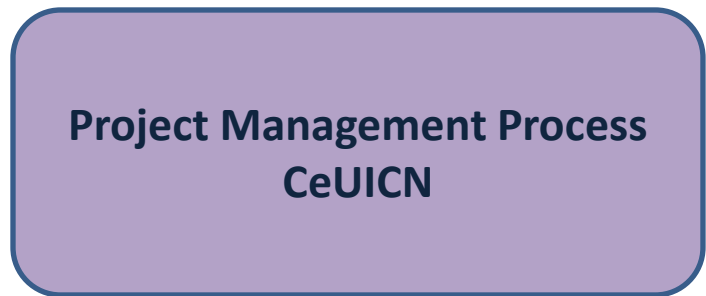
THE SPANISH COMMITTEE:
